## NHS Blood Drive

Thank you National Honor Society, student body, faculty, administration, and parents for your participation and support for the blood drive. The records show that 96 people participated in the blood drive. There were 42 first time donors. Overall, we collected 71 units, 11 units over our goal. As a school community, we can praise God that the blood collected will help as many as 213 hospital patients. ## Guidelines for Student Illnesses

Students should not attend school if they are experiencing the following: fever, vomiting, diarrhea, frequent coughing or sneezing, undiagnosed rash, or any infectious or contagious disease. Students with fever are asked to remain at home until they are fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medications. Students with diagnosed pink eye and strep infections should be treated with antibiotics for 24 hours before returning to school. Trinity Academy does not have a health room available for sick students. If a student becomes ill at school, the parent/guardian will be contacted and the student will be encouraged to go home.

## Dismissals/School Closings

When extreme weather occurs, school closings are broadcast on local TV stations 3, 10 and 12, usually by 6:30 a.m. Information will also be posted on the Trinity website. Parental judgment regarding driving conditions is honored and absences and/or tardiness will be excused in severe weather.
