CORE SUBJECTS *daily instruction*

BIBLE:

Resource: BJU Bible Truths

- Integrate doctrine through a chronological and thematic study of the Bible
- Study Cain, Abel, Seth, Job, Lot's wife, Elijah, Jesus, the apostles, Peter, Philip and Paul
- Study the following topics: Sin, salvation, purity, the life of Christ, willingness, friendships and obedience
- Practice spiritual disciplines: Prayer, study, worship and scripture memory
- Attend weekly chapel

READING/LANGUAGE ARTS:

Resource:s BJU English Language Arts and Institute for Excellence in Writing (IEW)

- Learn to read with accuracy, fluency and comprehension
- Transition from learning to read to reading to learn

MATH:

Resource: Saxon Math

- Learn that math mirrors God's stability
- Use appropriate units and tools to estimate, measure and compare
- Study basic geometry and fractions
- Gain automaticity with multiplication and division facts

HISTORY/SOCIAL STUDIES:

Resource: BJU Press Heritage Studies

- Study *map skills*: Cardinal and intermediate directions, grids, globe, latitude, longitude, hemispheres, landforms, prime meridian, equator and population map
- Study *American history*: Trail of Tears, Revolutionary War, French and Indian War, War with Great Britain, and the Civil War
- Study *Government*: Constitutional Convention, Bill of Rights, Articles of Confederation, Preamble, political parties and Electoral College
